

OBITUARY.

Albert Bement died at his home in this city Friday morning, July 20, 1906, aged 74 years.

Mr. Bement's illness was very brief, being confined to his home but a couple of weeks. The cause of his death was kidney trouble. His demise occurred between three and four o'clock Friday morning, which day was the anniversary of his birth.

The deceased was born in Victory, N. Y., July 20, 1834. While in young manhood he went to Ithica, N. Y., where in 1855 he was united in marriage to Miss Charity Kent. August 19, 1862, he enlisted in the army, and served until the close of the war, when he moved with his family to Plainfield, Iowa. From there he went to Mona where he lived about eight years. He then came to Nashua where he had lived for the past twenty years or more. He is survived by a wife and eight children who are as follows: Sylvester, of Little Falls, Minn.; Lester, of Osage; Mrs. Emily Louise Barr, of Nashua; Mrs. Addie Maria Unsworth, of Springfield, Mass; Mrs. Alzina Lewis, of Osage; McCarty Bement, of Nashua; Mrs. Edith Waterman, of Charles City, and Mrs. Dora Savener, of St. Paul. All of the children were present at the funeral services excepting Mrs. Unsworth and Mrs. Waterman, the latter being critically ill at her home in Charles City. Two daughters have preceded the father to the better land. He is also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Mary Freeburg, of Portland, Oregon, and Mrs. Sarah Hickok, of Nashua, the only surviving members of a family of nine children.

The deceased was a man who stood well in the community, being an honest and upright citizen. In his home he was a loving husband and father, and in his late sickness the loving hands of his family tenderly ministered to him.

The funeral services, under the auspices of the G. A. R., were held at the home at 2 p. m., Sunday, and the remains were interred in Oak Hill cemetery.
