

### Death of Henry Dodge.

Henry Dodge died at his home in Floyd, Friday, July 5th, 1895. The deceased has been in failing health for the past year, and for a month before the end, all hopes for his recovery were abandoned. His death was caused by a complication of diseases.

Henry Dodge was borne in McDonough, Chemango county, New York, September 10th, 1836. He moved with his parents to Rochester, when seven years of age and lived there for seven years. He came west with his mother in 1854, and lived for some years with his mother south of Greenwood. December 22, 1863, Mr. Dodge was enrolled in Co. H, 4th, Iowa Cav., with which he served for nearly three years being mustered out at Atlanta, Georgia, August 8th 1865. He was married to Catherine Poole at Polo, Illinois, Feb. 26th, 1872. They moved onto a farm west of Nashua shortly after marriage and resided there until three years ago when they moved to Floyd. Four sons besides the mother, are living to mourn his death. They are W. E., Herbert, Horace, and Loyal.

The remains were brought to Nashua for burial. Mr. Dodge was a member of Geo. W. S Dodge Post, G. A. R., and the funeral services were under their charge. The funeral services were held at the home of C. J. Poole on Sunday afternoon. Rev. H. C. Johnson as chaplain of the Post, conducting the services. The burial was at Greenwood. The funeral was one of the largest ever held in Nashua, and an immense cortege followed the remains to the grave.

Mr. Dodge was an honest man of sterling character, and made friends of all who knew him. The deceased left an influence of good wherever his influence fell, and he left to his family the priceless inheritance of an honored name.
