

At Rest.

In Nashua, Iowa, Sept 1, '93, of nervous prostration and partial paralysis, John Preston Parish died in his 70th year

The deceased was born in Ft Edward, N Y, May 9, 1823. He remained there until the age of manhood, then moved to Dansville, N Y, where he was united in marriage to Miss Mary A Coler, then moved to Appleton, Wis, where he engaged in building and architecture, remaining there until the death of his wife when he moved to Nashua, Iowa, where he was again united in marriage to Miss Helen M Coler who still survives him

Mr Parish was several years in active business in this city, but quit on account of failing health, and for the past year has been unable to leave his home. He was a kind husband, an obliging neighbor, a true friend. He bore his long sickness with great patience, and during his stay of three score years and ten on earth no one could speak a word against his purity of action and manly character. He has passed from earth to that bourne where the weary are at rest. To the bereaved wife who has so tenderly watched over him and administered to his many wants universal sympathy is extended by this whole community.

The funeral took place at the beautiful home on Lexington avenue, this city, on last Sunday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock. There was a large attendance of his old friends who wished to pay their last tribute to the dead. There was no formal sermon, but the prayer and appropriate remarks by Rev A H Sedgwick were full of kindness and consolation. The beautiful hymns so sweetly sung by the choir were soothing indeed. The singing of that noble hymn born of Heaven, "Sweet Bye and Bye," opened the flood gates of the heart, as was shown by the tearful eyes of many present. The remains were buried in beautiful Oak Hill Cemetery
