\* **TRUVEE COLLINS, CIVIL  
WAR VETERAN, IS DEAD**

\* **Passed Away at Cedar Rapids Sat-  
urday After Lingerin*g* Illness—  
Buried Here Tuesday**

at Truvee Collins, a veteran of the  
at Civil war and for many years a resi-  
dent of Nashua, died at a hospital in  
Cedar Rapids at 12:20 p. m. Sat-  
urday, Feb. 15, after a lingering ill-  
ness.

He had made his home with his  
nephew, R. S. Crowell, Cedar Rap-  
ids, for the last year and a half, go-  
ing from Nashua, where he had re-  
sided for more than thirty years.

Mr. Collins was born May 15,  
1846, in New York and during the  
war served with Co. H, 153rd Illi-  
nois Infantry. His wife preceded  
him in death a year and a half ago,  
and his sister, Mrs. Esther Crowell,  
died Dec. 28, 1929, in Cedar Rapids.  
He is survived by three nephews  
and a niece and by several step-chil-  
dren in Nashua. Mr. Collins was a  
member of the Z. T. Cook post G. A.  
R. of Cedar Rapids, and a former  
member of Geo. W. S. Dodge Post of  
Nashua.

Funeral services were held at Ce-  
dar Rapids Monday at 2:30 and on  
Tuesday the body was brought to  
Nashua for interment.
