

### Obituary.

Henry A. Conklin was born Nov. 7, 1836, at Rochester, N. Y., and died June 8, 1903 at his home in Nashua, aged 66 years and 7 months.

When a child he moved with his parents to Lansing, Mich. He enlisted in Company F, 6th regiment of Michigan volunteers, March 3, 1852 and served one year, being discharged for disability. He was united in marriage to Miss Mary McLarnan at Elkhart, Ind., Sept. 21, 1856. They removed from there to Nashua, Ia., September, 1868, where they have since made their home. Three children were born to them, Chas. H., of Babcock, Wis., O. A. Conklin and Mrs. Sadie Dana, of Nashua.

The deceased was the oldest of ten children, four sisters and two brothers of whom survive him, together with the wife and children. He was identified with the Odd Fellows, Knights of Pythias, also the Masonic fraternity.

The funeral services were held at his late residence and were conducted by Rev. A. D. Stevens, pastor of the M. E. church and the interment was at Oak Hill cemetery. Being an old settler and widely known, a large company of friends accompanied the remains to the cemetery.
