

### Ezra Fox Dead.

The death of Ezra Fox, at his home in Riverton, at 6 o'clock Wednesday morning, came as a shock to the community as the majority of the people had not learned of his illness.

Mr. Fox was first taken ill on Friday morning with heart trouble and hemorrhages of the bowels and he failed rapidly until the end came. The origin of his disease is said to date back to the time when he was imprisoned in Andersonville prison for a period of thirteen months.

The deceased was born in New York Jan. 5, 1844. From there he moved to Illinois, and thirty-four years ago he came to Nashua, Iowa, settling upon a farm west of town. He was united in marriage to Miss Helen Wicker, in Illinois, some forty years ago. Seven children were born to this union, who are as follows: Arthur, of Pierre, S. D., Mrs. Etta

Leaman, of Charles City; Mrs. Bell Jones and Charles, of Tracy, Minn.; Bert, of Grindstone, S. D.; Royal and Harry, of Nashua. Besides the wife and children his death is also mourned by two brothers, Egbert and Oscar, of David City, Neb., and two sisters, Mrs. Evelyn Peeler, of Dundee, Ill., and Mrs. Eleanor Ladd, of Plainfield.

The wife and all the children, excepting Arthur and Bert, and the two sisters were present to witness the passing away of a loved husband, father and brother, and one who was respected by those who knew him.

The funeral will be held from the home at 1 o'clock Friday afternoon and the burial will be in Oak Cemetery. Dr. Hirsch of the Charles City College will conduct the services and music will be furnished by the college quartet.
