

FORMER RESIDENT DEAD.

**Rudolph Freeburg Passes Away at
Home of Daughter in Portland.**

Mrs. Sarah Hickok received a letter last week from her niece Mrs. B. Towne, of Portland, Ore., which contained the news of the death of the latter's father, Rudolph Freeburg, for many years a resident of Nashua. Mr. Freeburg moved from here to Hubbard, Minn., and later to Portland. Death resulted from heart trouble. He had a severe attack last summer but recovered sufficiently to be able to walk to the city, but he was again stricken in September and on Thanksgiving day he suffered another attack from which he never rallied entirely, altho on the day of his death he was able to be up. He expired suddenly at midnight. The following notice of his death was published in the Portland papers:

"Rudolph Freeburg, a native of Switzerland and in his 83d year died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. B. J. Towne, Wednesday. Mr. Freeburg came to the United States when a lad of 13 and when the Civil war began enlisted in the 6th New York cavalry. He was in the battle of Gettysburg and many other engagements. After the war he settled in Iowa, and then removed to Minnesota. Thirteen years ago he came to Portland to be with his children and has not engaged in any active pursuit for several years. Mr. Freeburg was a member of the Sumner Post No. 12, G. A. R., and under its auspices the funeral was held from the Holman chapel Friday afternoon. Burial was in the G. A. R. cemetery. Surviving Mr. Freeburg are two daughters and three sons, Mrs. Towne and F. L. Freeburg of Portland; Mrs. H. E. Delaney, Hubbard, Minn.; A. W. Freeburg, Charles City, Iowa; U. H. Freeburg, Carson, Wash. There are 11 grandchildren."

Mr. Freeburg was a member of the Grand Army Post at Nashua about 19 years ago. His wife who died seven years ago was a sister of Mrs. Hickok.
