

## FOLLOWS WIFE IN DEATH.

### W. H. Reynolds Answers Final Summons Saturday.

W. H. Reynolds, an aged and respected resident of this community passed away Saturday at the home of his son Frank Reynolds just south of Nashua. On January 12, his wife passed to the great beyond and since her death the aged husband who had been in poor health for several years seemed to desire only to follow his life partner into that peaceful sleep from which there is no awakening.

William Henry Reynolds was born July 4, 1826, at Providence, R. I., where he grew to manhood. He came to Illinois where he was married to Fannie Fell, Oct. 2, 1849, and to this union four children were born namely, Mrs. James McClinton, of Hinsdale, Ill.; Mrs. Addie Fentiman, of Stillwater, Okla.; Frank Reynolds, of Nashua; and Mrs. Foster, of Waterloo, who passed away in 1898.

In 1862 he enlisted in the 127th Illinois Vol., at Lyonsville, Ill., and served his country until he was wounded at the battle of Vicksburg, after which he was honorably discharged and came home. He came to Iowa in 1874 and has lived in this state since, for the past few years at the home where he passed away.

Funeral services were held at the home Monday at 2 p. m., conducted by Rev. Paul Pease and interment was at Oak Hill by the side of his recently deceased wife. The Grand Army Post had charge of the service at the grave.
