

Former Nashua Citizen Dead.

Died, in Rapid City, Saturday, May 13, 1905, Cornelious W. Strohm, of a complication of diseases, aged 70 years, 6 months and 11 days.

Deceased was born in Lebanon county, Penn., Oct. 22, 1834. From Pennsylvania he moved to Wisconsin, where he was living when the war of the Rebellion broke out, and he enlisted and served his country faithfully as a soldier. On July 3, 1866, he married Miss Susanah Winklebleck, who survives him. From Wisconsin they moved to Nashua, Ia., and in 1886 they moved to Rapid City.

To their home have come seven children, and all but two were at his bedside when life departed. Last winter when Mr. Strohm had a long serious illness all of the children came home to see him, so that the two who did not reach home in time to see him this time need not feel greatly disappointed. Those who were present were: Mrs. Jessie May Tallent, of Denver; Mrs. Almeda Jane Vetal, of Sheridan, Wyo.; Mrs. Ada E. Gerster, of Victor, Col.; Mrs. Ethel L. McGothlin, of Topeka, Kas.; and Eva, who lives here at home. Miss Lucile Strohm, of Denver, and Mrs. Emma Latimer, of Denver, who are expected to arrive today.

Mr. Strohm was a member of Harney Post G. A. R., of the Rapid City lodge, A. F. & A. M., and also a member of the Congregational church of this city. Until recently he was a man of rugged health, but for the past two years he has been in poor health, having had a very serious sick spell several months ago. He was well known here, and respected for his many sterling qualities. He was a good man in his home, which statement is given

by the tender love given him by all the members of his family.

The funeral will be held Monday afternoon at the residence at 2 o'clock. Owing to the avoidable absence of Rev. S. G. Butcher, the Presbyterian minister, Rev. W. J. Mitchell, will conduct the service.

The sympathy of all is extended to the members of the family who have thus lost their best friend.—Rapid City, (S. D.,) Daily Journal.
