

**Death of William Janes.**

William Janes died at his residence Wednesday morning, March 10th, in the 68th year of his age. The cause of Mr. Janes' death was tuberculosis, brought on by rheumatism, which he contracted while in the war of the late rebellion. Mr. Janes was by occupation a farmer, but the rheumatism crippled him so badly four years ago, that he has been almost a helpless invalid since that time. Mr. Janes never left his bed after November 4th, but was able to vote for President McKinley which was a great satisfaction to him.

William Janes was born in Erie Co., New York, July 23, 1829. He was married to Miss Martha Ross at Little Prairie, Wisconsin, came with two sons to Nashua in 1884. Seven children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Janes, two of whom with the mother, are living. The sons are Fred Janes of Charles City, and W. T. Janes of Nashua.

Wm. Janes was a member of Co. I, 13th Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry and served his country eighteen months. He was a member of Geo. W. S. Dodge Post, G. A. R., and at the request of the deceased, that organization will have charge of the funeral services, which will be held at two o'clock. Rev. Davis will conduct a prayer service. The burial will be at Greenwood cemetery this afternoon.
