

William H. Tupper.

William H. Tupper died at his home in Brooklyn, Wednesday afternoon, October 16th. He was an upright man in all walks of life, and such men as he are ever esteemed and respected by their fellows. He lived right in the sight of his neighbors and his Maker. For the last twelve years his health has been very poor. The funeral was held Friday afternoon, Rev. Smith officiating. The burial service of the Grand Army was also observed. The burial was at Greenwood.

W. H. Tupper was born in Madison county, New York, October 22nd, 1841. Moved to Wisconsin in 1848. He was married to Caroline M. Johnson, October 9th, 1863. Served in the 17th Wisconsin vol. infantry from Nov. 3rd, 1861, until the close of the war. Removed with his family to Nashua, Iowa, in 1870, where he was a resident until his death.

Deceased was 53 years, 11 months and 24 days of age. He united with the Methodist church in 1873. Mr. Tupper leaves a wife and two children, Sherman and Ellen. He has three brothers, Spencer and John of Nashua, and Charles of Minneapolis.
