A Good Man Answers Final Summons.

William Zwanziger passed away at his home in Brooklyn Saturday afternoon, after a long illness, the nature of his trouble being Brights disease.

William Zwanziger was born in Bedford county, Pennsylvania, Feb. 12, 1843, and died Nashua, Iowa, Oct. 30, 1909, at the age of 66 years, 8 months and 18 days. When two years of age he came with his parents to Grant county, Wis., where he grew to manhood. December 18, 1863, he enlisted in the 25th Regiment, Wisconsin Volunteers, from Grant county, to serve three years during the war of the Rebellion. He was discharged on the 27th day of July, in 1865. On July 7, 1867, he was united in marriage to Miss Catherine Fate, at Dubuque, Iowa, and continued to reside in Grant county until March, 1870, when he moved with his family onto a farm near Horton, Iowa, where he resided for 27 years. In March, 1897, he retired from the farm and came to Nashua where he has since lived. He leaves to mourn their loss a wife and seven children, John, of Frederika; Mike and Mrs. Wm. Stephens, of Republic; Mrs. Roy Cagley, Roy, Charles and Willie, of Nashua; Fred having died at Fargo, N. D., Oct. 16, 1901. He is also survived by two brothers and one sister, Fred, of Waverly; George, of Republic, and Mrs. John Deitz, of Nashua.

The deceased was one of Nashua's best beloved citizens; a man who never interfered with the affairs of others, but attended strictly to his own, dealing with his fellow men at all times in a fair and honest manner, and the exemplary life he lived caused him to have a host of friends.

The funeral service, under the charge of the Grand Army Post, of which deceased was an honored member, was held at the Congregational church at 10:30 a. m. Tuesday, Rev. Sinden preaching the sermon and the large concourse of people who assembled to pay their last tribute of respect to the dead was a mute token of the high regard in which the departed was held. The burial was in Greenwood cemetery.
