

### Obituary of C. T. Bromley,

Charles Timothy Bromley was born Feb. 15, 1831, in Lewis, Essex county, New York, and died at his home in Nashua, Iowa, March 18, 1914, at the age of 83 years, 1 month and 3 days.

He enlisted in Co. K, 58th Illinois Volunteer Infantry, Aug. 15, 1862, and served about three years. He was present at the battles of Perryville, Oct. 8, 1862; Stone River, Dec. 31, 1862; Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863, and Mission Ridge Nov. 25, 1863. He came to Iowa in 1864 and was married to Marion McCormick Dec. 16, 1869. They settled on a farm in Butler county and lived there until seven years ago, when they moved to Nashua. Two children were born to them, Walter, who resides near Carville, and Mrs. Fannie Peterson, who lives near Nashua.

He was a kind and loving husband and father, caring for home. He was ill for some time during which his children assisted by his step-daughter helped his wife in loving tender care.

Besides his wife, son and daughter, he leaves four grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Edle E. Moore, of Charles City, Iowa.

Funeral services were held at the home Saturday afternoon, conducted by Rev. B. W. Burleigh, of the Congregational church. Interment was at Oak Hill cemetery.
