

Obituary of Truman Merritt.

Truman Merritt died at the State Soldiers' Home at Marshalltown, on Monday, Feb. 13, 1922, in his 86th year. Deceased was among one of the first settlers in the county, settling with his parents when a small boy on the old home place two miles east of Nashua, where he grew to manhood. When the Civil war broke out he answered his country's call, and when the war was over he received an honorable discharge, returning to his parents' home. After several years he entered the soldiers' home and spent the remainder of his life with his comrades.

His father and mother and several brothers and sisters have passed to the great beyond.

Funeral services were held at Wm. Lundt's undertaking parlors Wednesday afternoon, at 2 p. m., Feb. 15th, and the body was laid to rest by members of the Grand Army Post in the family lot at Greenwood.
